
Rosalind Wise

Mexican culture, Aztec mythology, and Catholic iconography, Kahlo made use of traditional interpretations to heighten and contrast her own connection to each element. The result is a kaleidoscopic illustration of her feelings on everything from her intimate experiences with chronic pain and tumultuous relationships to her broader views on identity, culture, resistance, and creativity—the profound reality of her life.


Georgia O'Keeffe

Dramatic in color and composition but with a remarkable, sensual sensitivity, Georgia O'Keeffe's paintings stunned critics and the public alike. A pioneer of Modernism, she walked her own path in the art world, making noteworthy and influential progress without sounding any great fanfare of her own. Experimenting with abstraction and color, she created a style that is as original as it is powerful. O'Keeffe lived to be 98 years old and completed over 2,000 works—an oeuvre that has forever left its stamp on American art.


Gardens of the Impressionists

The Impressionists were known for capturing their subjects in the moment, creating landscapes and scenes of everyday life that act as snapshots of time. Gardens were the perfect source of inspiration: the breathtaking colors and shapes of the flowers and foliage complemented the Impressionists' playful approach to painting. Careful attention to color and light, along with their characteristic rapid brushstrokes, allowed these painters to produce masterpieces that encourage us to reimagine how we see the gardens, blossoms, and greenery surrounding us.

Claude Monet

Claude Monet's Impressionist works were revolutionary when they were created, and to this day he is considered one of the greatest painters in the history of art. With agile brushwork and a then-daring artistic style, he recorded his impressions of nature in everyday settings. He was fascinated by the interplay of sunlight, breezes, and water, and in his gardens he devoted himself to perfecting the depiction of light and atmosphere.





Filled with swirling patterns in jewel tones, Gustav Klimt's glamorous paintings of women epitomize the Austrian Art Nouveau movement known as the Vienna Secession. One of its cofounders, Klimt produced works of startling power, symbolism, and eroticism, culminating in what came to be known as his "Golden Phase," when he used gold leaf in many of his paintings. The artworks shown here trace Klimt's growth from adept painter to confident master.

These adaptations of butterfly woodblock prints by Kamisaka Sekka represent a mixture of his modern and traditional artistic styles. He was one of the last great masters of Rinpa, a painting style featuring graphic designs, sometimes including embellishments like gold leaf and silver leaf, and often referencing nature literature.







Hopper summered in New England but was born and raised in Nyack, New York, studied painting at the New York School of Art, and wintered in Greenwich Village. The outcome of this dual residency is a body of work rich in rural landscapes and seascapes, as well as studies of city life.


Charley Harper






Molly Hashimoto

Reveling in color theory and the use of light, rhythm, and aerial perspective, Thomas invites us to interpret our world in a new way through her paintings.

Mark Rothko

Mark Rothko, a titan among modern painters, said that his works capture the extremes of human emotion. His extraordinary achievement was communicating tragedy and elation through simple forms. Rothko's signature motif was soft-edged rectangles set against a monochrome background.

Born Marcus Rothkowitz in Dvinsk, Russia (now Daugavpils, Latvia), the artist emigrated to the United States at age 10. After a series of artistic transformations, he established himself as a leader among New York's avantgarde in the late 1940s. In the wake of a global war and holocaust, devastation had pushed creative impulses in radically new directions.








Carl Larsson's atmospheric paintings speak to the joys of everyday family life in the Swedish countryside at the turn to the 20th century. The serene images Larsson presented in his watercolors became widely popular, influencing Scandinavian art and design. Depicting his wife and children (all eight of them!), shoreside strolls, friends, neighbors, and evening rituals, these windows into the artist's life evoke a sense of calm and domesticity. A handful of the images in this calendar were published in his splendidly wholesome series *A Home*, published between 1894 and 1897.

An artist both of her time and well ahead of it, Hilma af Klint was a rare original. Years before Modernist innovators Mondrian and Kandinsky dipped their brushes into abstraction, af Klint broke ground with colorful, energetic compositions that veered away from the figurative. Influenced by her experiences with spiritualism, she tried to reconcile art, science, and religious pluralism through her paintings. Determining that the world wasn't ready for it, she decreed that her work—now celebrated—not be exhibited until 20 years after her death.


Michelangelo di Lodovico Buonarroti Simoni, known simply as Michelangelo, was a child prodigy who became one of the most revered artists in history. He apprenticed in the court of the Medici dynasty of bankers and art patrons in Florence, Italy, where he studied classical antiquities and was surrounded by poets, philosophers, and artists. Like his High Renaissance contemporary (and rival) Leonardo da Vinci, Michelangelo was known for evocative works of physical realism. Among his triumphs is the ceiling of Vatican City's Sistine Chapel; its renowned centerpiece, *The Creation of Adam*, illustrates the "divine breath of life."

About 1,200 miles north of Toronto, the hamlet of Kinngait, Nunavut, is home to a multigenerational Inuit community of graphic artists. Their cooperatively owned Kinngait Studios has been in continuous operation since 1959, producing unique, captivating, and powerful prints, which are known and collected all over the world. Pomegranate has enjoyed a decades-long collaboration with the cooperative, and these calendars rank among our best sellers, year after year.



Kenojuak Ashevak is widely considered a Canadian national treasure. She was a groundbreaking artist for Kinngait Studios, in the Arctic territory of Nunavut, and ultimately a pioneer of modern Inuit art. After establishing her reputation in 1960 with *The Enchanted Owl*—an image so popular it was reproduced on a Canadian postage stamp—she worked nearly nonstop. She contributed to Kinngait's print collection almost every year and completed countless special commissions. Ashevak loved to make pictures of birds, particularly owls. Reflecting on her art, she said, "I am the light of happiness, and I am a dancing owl."
